p. 264 The settlement of Constable dates from 1800. The first white settlers were Jonathan Hapgood and Christopher (Kit) Austin who were relatives from Milton, VT locating on the south line of the present town. Peleg Austin had a place nearby at about the same time. Local tradition is that "Kit" Austin was a hunter and trapper, but he must have been a man of substance.

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too, for his holdings in Constable comprised nearly 300 acres, and in 1805 he conveyed 100 acres in Malone, west of the present village, to Oliver Brewster, and a few years later 50 acres in the northern part of Malone to Pliny Burgess. In 1808 he was an assessor of the town, in 1814 a lieut. in Capt. Asaph Perry's company of the militia, and in 1816 its captain. His Constable property he sold in 1835 to Daniel and William Bassett. The Hapgood farm adjoined Austin, and is still in the possession of descendants of its original owner. It was here, in the Hapgood house, that Malone's first town meeting was held in 1805, when Malone (then called Harison) included all of the county

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west of the Burke, Belmont, and Franklin.

Mrs. Sally Gainer – This venerable lady, the widow of Bryan R. Gainer, is in her 84th year and although totally blind can spin her “dozen cuts” a day. She became blind in 1884, was blind 13 years, then recovered her sight one year and once more became blind. She relates an incident of pioneer life, originating a local proverb known as “David’s Dumplings”. In early times the settlers banded together to do their farm work, as defense against Indians. Thus going from farm to farm. One of them, David Williams, was so long from home that a dish of dumplings, which he had left on the table, was covered with mold upon his return. Peeping into the house to see that the coast was clear, he caught sight of the dumplings, and mistaking them, woolly as they were, for an opossum which had taken possession of this table, he fired at the object, broke the plate and scattered the dumplings. After that, anything very old and stale was “David’s Dumplings.”

In 1669 lots were again drawn and Daniel drew lot 23. On May 17, 1671, Daniel took oath of allegiance to the King and the Colony of RI. Apr. 6, 1675 Daniel Crumb married Sarah Harris and a few months later Thomas Minor married Daniel Crumb and Rachel Roberts on Nov. 7, 1676. Several genealogists believe that this means that Rachel was a Harris who first married a Roberts and was a widow when she married Daniel. Some believe that she was a sister of the prominent William and Thomas Harris

Associated of Roger Williams, and that her first husband was Thomas Roberts of Providence and Newport. During King Phillip's war, Westerly was practically abandoned. Daniel, perhaps, put himself under the care of Connecticut, as he became a Connecticut volunteer in the war against the Indians. His name is 103 on the list in order of enlistments. As a reward he received from the Colony about 35 acres in the present town of Voluntown, so named in honor of the volunteers. He received lot 111. Tupper Genealogy, by Franklin Whittlesey Tupper, 1945

p. 20 Captain Thomas Tupper became a Freeman at 20 and in 1658, with his father, was listed as one of the largest land holders. He served on a jury in 1664, was one of two excisemen in 1667 and town constable in 1669. He early became one of the most prominent citizens, serving as selectman for 14 years, town clerk from 1675 to 1685, deputy to the General Court at Plymouth for 11 years, representative to the

court in Boston and in 1680 was appointed lieutenant of the military company in Sandwich, becoming Captain in 1690. He had strong religious connections and for many years was a missionary among the Indians of the Mashpee and Herring Pond tribes.

p. 24 Eliakim Tupper was a man of prominence in Sandwich, selectman for 12 years, being the first elected in 1712; one of a committee "to supply the pulpit" in 1722 and was a large landholder and a "shopkeeper". p. 562 Moses Austin, an American who obtained the first grant from the Mexican Government for the formation of an American colony in Texas; b. Durham, CT Oct. 4, 1761, died June 10, 1821. He forwarded to the commandant general at Monterey an application for permission to colonize 300 families in some part of Texas. The application was successful, and the enterprise prosecuted by his son Stephen F. Austin.

Oscar Phelps Austin, American statistician; b. Newark, IL; died N.Y.C. Jan. 6, 1933. At the age of 12 he moved with his parent to NE. He engaged in journalism in Chicago, Cincinnati, and Washington.

Stephen Fuller Austin. American pioneer; b. Wythe County, VA 1793; died Dec. 27, 1836. He was the son of Moses Austin and is the eponym of Austin, Texas. His grant

for a colony in Texas gave him almost absolute power over the colonists. The colony prospered as did other similar associations until in March 1833 a convention was held to form a constitution for the as yet Mexican state of Texas. Austin urged a union of all municipalities in Texas to provide against the consequences of the probably refusal of the Mexican Government to ratify the constitution. He was accused of treason, arrested, and held as a hostage until 1835. After his release he was appointed a commissioner to the United States. This was before the Texan Declaration of Independence, and is was not until after his arrival at New Orleans and the information of the union of Santa Ana with the Federal Party for the Invasion of Texas, that he recommended such a measure. He was then successful in

preparing for the independence and annexation of the new republic. When Samuel Houston became president, he appointed Austin his Secretary of State.

Warren Robinson Austin was named in June 1946 by President Truman as U.S. Representative on the United Nations Security Council. One of the most internationally – minded members of Congress, he stepped into his present position after the resignation of Edward R. Stettinius. He was joint sponsor of the Austin-Wadsworth Bill (1943) which would have authorized the drafting of men and women for war work.

p. 563 Austin, William, American Author, born Lunenburg, MA Mar. 2, 1778; died 1841. Remembered for his striking and original tale "Peter Rubb, the Missing
