A tavern keeper Isaac Emery a Republican – Political feeling was running high, and one Aaron Austin, a Federalist, who kept an opposition tavern in the village, headed a company of his partisans in a call of no friendly intent upon the soldiers at Emery's hostelry. In the bar-room altercation soon ensued and words led to blows – with Austin busy in the scrimmage. Soon, however, the Captain appeared upon the scene – “a powerful man, 6 ft. 6 in. his stockings, well proportioned, and weighing 250 lbs.” – and snatching up the belligerent

inn-keeper, “threw him out of an open window upon the green.”

Previous – Capt. John McNeil of Hillsborough, and raised a company for the “11th, and marched to Concord. Not finding accommodation for his men in the main village, he took them to East Concord and quartered them at the tavern of Isaac Emery. (begin with this)

Dover, NH (Scales, Vol. 1, p. 3372, 1923)

Joseph Austin, who owned part of the mill property at Cochecho Falls in 1649, and later resided at Dover Neck, having come there probably from Hampton, where a Joseph Austin resided 1642. He moved up to Cochecho at an early date, through where his house was we have no means of knowing. In addition to the mill property he has various grants from the town; one was as follows –

CT in 1636, and Michael and Gerrard, who located in Haddam, CT. Gerrard Spencer joined his son Michael, in Haddam in 1662, where it is presumed he lived out the remainder of his days.

Lieut. William Spencer took the freeman's oath in 1632/3 in Cambridge, and was a deputy to the General Court, 1634 – 1637/8. Mar. 1636-7, he was appointed "Lieut. of Military Co. of Newtowne" and was one of the 5 persons named in the charter of the "Military Company of Massachusetts", which was granted by the General Court in Mar. 1638. After removing to Hartford, CT, he took an active part in the government of the town and served as a Deputy

to the General Court, 1639 – 40. In his will, dated may 4, 1640, and probated mar. 4, 1640-1 he mentions his wife, son Samuel, daughters Sarah and Elizabeth, and appointed as overseers "my cousin Mathew Allen, my brother John Pratt and John Taylcoate". The records show his widow m. Wm. Edwards.

He removed to Taunton in 1645, Windsor, CT. In 1659 to Northampton, MA. He lived there 40 years and was one of the leading men in the affairs of the town and church.

His first wife's name is unknown. He married in England. She died on the passage or soon after.

He married Dec. 1630 (2) Abigail Ford of Dorchester, MA. They were married 58 years. She died, mother of 16 children, July 6, 1688, aged 80. He died Apr. 14, 1699, ae 94. Thomas Ford was the father of Mrs. Abigail Ford Strong of Dorchester.

p. 207 William Clarke is first inauspiciously recorded in Hartford, CT on Jan. 2, 1639, while he was in the relation of servant to John Crow of that place and "was fined 40 s for mesdemeano' in drinking, and corporall punishment was remitted uppon he pr'mice of his care for future to avoyd such occations."

His term of service to John Crow was evidently completed by 1642, for in December of that year Hartford granted him "to hafe" one half of a tract earlier allotted to John Pearce on the east side of the road to the cow pasture and adjacent to the home of Thomas Hungerford.

William was one of the group which removed to Haddam in 1662, where his home lot

lay next north of that of George Gates. Here he showed himself to be a helpful and respected member of the community, for in 1669 he was appointed a special commissioner from Haddam to the General Court, with power to employ council if necessary regarding the boundry dispute with Saybrook. He was also one of the building committee for the first meeting house at Haddam and in Nov. 1674, he assisted in taking an inventory of the estate of Thomas Smith. Of his sons Joseph and Thomas remained in Haddam, John went to Middletown, and William is said to have settled in Wethersfield.

William married probably by 1645 but the name of his wife, who survived him, has not been learned. His will dated June 30, 1681 William d. July 22, 1681. Inventory of estate showed valuation L 412-18-00 [see below]
